Sports Registration

Registration for winter sports (Alpine Skiing, Basketball, Bowling, Snowshoeing, Spirit Fitness, Young Athletes Program) is now closed. **REMEMBER:** Athletes that registered for basketball should review the <u>Policy on Participating in Team</u> <u>Sports</u> before the season begins to ensure that you can make the team commitment for attending all competitions, including State Games which will be held on April 6-7, 2024.

Registration for spring sports (Athletics, Bocce, Cheerleading, Poms, Hip Hop Dance, Pickleball, Softball, Swimming and Spirit Fitness) will open on February 1st.
